# It's not OK to stay away!

The thought of an argument with children to get them to school is too great to bear for some parents. Too many students miss school through parent-condoned absences. Every day a student is away they are missing out on various learning experiences.

If a child misses school for around 1 day a week, by the end of the year they will have missed almost



1 whole term of school. Over the primary school years they would miss almost 3 years of school.

## What is a Justified Absence from school?

- 1. For an unavoidable medical or dental appointment. (best made for after school or in the holidays).
- 2. To attend a recognised religious holiday.
- 3. To attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. a funeral).
- 4. While sick or with an infectious disease.

#### Check-in assessment for Years 4 and 6

This week students from Years 4 and 6 participated in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment.

The check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning following the period of learning from home.

The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

## Year 5 Opportunity Class Placement - 2022

The application process for Year 5 opportunity class placement for entry in 2022 is about to begin, with online applications opening tomorrow. We would like to remind you that all Intention to Apply forms must be returned to the class teacher tomorrow, as they are an indication to the school that you intend to register your child for the test.

## NAPLAN - Yrs 3 & 5

In May 2021 the National Assessment Program -Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

In 2021, your child will sit the NAPLAN tests. As students are assessed on the same literacy and numeracy curriculum content, regardless of whether they complete the test online or on paper, results

for both formats can be reported on the same NAPLAN assessment scale.

This year students in Years 3 & 5 will be sitting the NAPLAN test starting Tuesday 11th May.

At Kentlyn Public School, we value the importance of a healthy and nutritious

breakfast. Research indicates that children who have eaten breakfast can concentrate better and have a longer attention span, helping them to learn and study better. They can also perform better physically after eating breakfast as there is more energy available to their muscles. Breakfast can improve behaviour and mood, as children have better concentration and aren't tired or hungry.

Our School Leaders and Stage 3 helpers will once again be running this program for this year. This is a fantastic initiative that will support all our students,

Monday - Friday. This year we have purchased 2 cereal dispensers to assist with the service of cereal. I would like to officially acknowledge and congratulate our School Leaders on their enthusiasm and dedication to this initiative.

## Nurturing the artist in your child

Your child may not go on to become a famous musician, actor, dancer, filmmaker or artist.

But by nurturing the artist in your child you can help them grow up able to think for themselves, problem solve and work out different ways to do things.

They'll also be better able to see different points of view, communicate and express their feelings in different ways.

Here are some top tips:

Stimulate your child's senses opportunities for your child to experience different sights, smells, sensations and sounds. These sensory activities are food for the brain.

Don't overschedule your child - Resist the temptation to overcrowd your child with organised activities in an attempt to nurture their creativity. Allow them time to be alone, to daydream and to think.

Encourage experimentation and exploration - A cardboard box has limitless potential. Provide materials and objects that encourage your child to explore ideas, experiment, imagine, play and perform. Encourage difference - Artists and performers respond to the world in many different ways. Move outside your own comfort zone and introduce your child to different kinds and styles of art, music, drama and dance.

Encourage hard work and perseverance - Show appreciation for your child's efforts and suppress the impulse to complete tasks for your child.

Learn from mistakes and learn to take risks -Whether things go well or not, try asking your child these questions: "What worked?", "What didn't work?", "What did you do well or what are you pleased with?", "What would you like to work on?" and "How can I help?"

## No Hat - Play Under Cover

A kind reminder to everyone that we are following and monitoring, more than ever. Our "No Hat - Play Under Cover". Please ensure that your child has their school hat with them every day.

## Empower Hour

During Terms 2 & 3, our Year 6 students will be involved in "Empower Hour" on Friday afternoons. This is a student voice initiative where students will have their say on a project that matters to them. Year 6 student leaders from Kentlyn and Ruse Public Schools will work together during Empower Hour to compete in the "Game Changer Challenge". Kentlyn Public School will host these weekly sessions in the school library. This is a design thinking challenge, where students will work collaboratively in small groups to explore solutions for a real-world problem. We will have an Empower Hour Showcase at the end of Term 3, to share students' projects with parents and carers.

## Maths Olympiad

This year we have entered a group of students from Years 4-6 in the Maths Olympiad Competition. This competition consists of a series of 5 separate contests spread across the year. Students participated in the first competition last term and we have another coming up later this week. It is a difficult competition and students are congratulated for the persistence they demonstrated when attempting to solve these problems.

In addition to the competition, students will continue to participate in a number of combined training sessions with the Ruse Public School Maths Olympiad team. These training sessions took place at Ruse Public School last term and this term Kentlyn will host them in our library. These training sessions will provide students with an opportunity to learn how to apply their mathematical skills in unique and creative ways.

#### InitiaLit

This year we have purchased the InitiaLit program. This evidence-based whole-class literacy program has been implemented in our K-2 classrooms from Term 1. It is designed to provide our students with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers. The key components of this program is a shift to decodable texts (books with words that can be sounded out) in the early stages of reading. It focuses on phonics, oral language skills, vocabulary and comprehension. If you're a parent or carer of a child in K-2 and would like more information about this program, please join
