We will also have our school uniform on display and you will be able to purchase your child's school uniform ready for Wednesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021.

updates and information to you via the two above mentioned websites. We will be posting information on both these virtual sites to further assist your child with getting to know our school and some of the routines ready for 2021. Through this App, we will send out videos showcasing our staff, students and school. This will help your child get to know staff and the school prior to him / her starting in 2021.

#### 2021 dates to add to your calendar:

# Friday 29<sup>th</sup> January, Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2021 – Best Start assessment and transition days.

- All Kindergarten students participate in Best Start Assessments before beginning school. Best Start Kindergarten Assessment identifies student's literacy and numeracy skills on entry to Kindergarten. This assessment is purely for us as classroom teachers to assess where your child is to ensure that we cater for their individual needs. The assessment should take approximately 45 minutes. They will be assessed in literacy and numeracy.
- As a way of transitioning your child to kindergarten we are also organising for your child to stay and experience a day in kindergarten, until 2:30pm. Our new Assistant Principal Mrs Sarah Harris, will be supervising the students in the 2021 Kindergarten classroom. The transition will be five to six students per day, depending on the day that your child has been assigned.

### Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February – Friday 5<sup>th</sup> February

• All Kindergarten students attend school for full days, with the support of Mrs Mammoliti, our School Learning Support Officer, the classroom teacher and Mrs Harris.

Please note that there might be variations to this proposed plan, depending on the Department of Education's updated Covid-19 guidelines and requirements.
